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INTRODUCTION

Definition of a principle

“A principle is a law that governs in the Mind” (To make us what we are (should be) today – determining our characters.)

As believers we want ‘The Word of God’ to have such an effect on us that we ‘instinctively’ live out what God wants from us. These principles are from the very heart of Christ our Lord. So, as we yield our wills and our minds to the instruction of the word, instinctively our decisions and actions will be from the indwelling Christ.

These are the teachings of Christ that teach and show us how to come into the correct relationship with Him, and to live in victory – regardless of the circumstance.

How to use this work book

Each of the following studies has 4 to 6 questions. Each question should be researched and prayerfully answered. There are no ‘YES’ or ‘NO’ answers.

All the relevant scriptures needed for the answers have been carefully selected so that the correct answers can be given, you may find many more scriptures which will help you with your answers.

The local fellowship oversight or whoever will conduct the course will then allocate how many studies need to be completed - preferably on a weekly basis. Each new believer who then starts the course, will fill in their answers in the allocated space, should the allocated space not be sufficient please use extra paper.

The overseer will then work through the studies, answering and correcting whatever is necessary thus ensuring the believer understands. The discretion and discernment of the local oversight can determine the effective application of this course. The purpose is that each believer understands fully what their God given salvation and new walk with the Lord is truly about.

This workbook can also be used by any believer for their own personal knowledge and understanding, working through it by themselves. It would however, be advisable to draw on those established in the Faith to confirm their answers.

STUDY 1 – YOUR SALVATION

God's Love, Grace and Mercy

Question 1: Have you tasted of the grace of God?

Answer: To be saved, one has to have received the unmerited favour of God, which is undeserved; could not have been paid for by any means, simply having received God's love and acceptance in Jesus alone. The joy, love, peace and knowledge of sins forgiven, becoming a son of God, and by receiving Jesus as Lord and Saviour. How glorious is simply tasting the grace of God?!

Question 2: What is the 'milk of the word'?

Answer: It is the fundamental teaching of the word of God for babes (new believers) in Christ; that one may grow spiritually. The 1st blocks of one's Christian foundation being the Apostle's doctrine and the 1st Principles of the oracles of God, easily heard, digested and understood. Also the necessity to be reminded of as one grows and matures in Christ.

Question 3: What is the 'meat' of the word?

Answer: It is now the instinctive response to the word that has born fruit and the necessary obedience to it, willingly making Godly decisions that affect every aspect of one's life. Strong meat is applying and using the word of God skillfully in the most trying circumstances, being able to discern both good and evil and acting thereon in faith.

Question 4: When do you become a mature Christian?

Answer: When Christ is Lord of all in one's life, and the flesh, old man, carnal man, has no more hold and is continually mortified (brought under – destroyed) by the spirit that now rules within. The living, enlightened word of God becomes the very bread of life, whereby one can grow in grace and the knowledge of Him. When no one or anything affects and influences our decision to serve our God.

STUDY 1

Question 5: When do you become a mature Christian?

Answer: Have an open heart and renewed mind, being obedient to the instruction of the word of God. Not allowing one's own will to influence the prompting of the word of God from the spirit within, as one's own will wants to be satisfied. Listening to the Lord speak in the meetings, where 'unprompted' by one's personal situation, God speaks through His ministries and also being confirmed by the gifts of the Holy Ghost. Fulfilling one's ministry, gift, in the body of Christ – not thinking more highly of oneself, but soberly as God has dealt to every man the measure of faith.

Question 6: When do you become a mature Christian?

Answer: So that we can:

- Be skillful in the word of righteousness
- Not be dull of hearing Teach others
- Grow
- Be able to discern between good and evil

STUDY 1

STUDY 2 – REPENTANCE FROM DEAD WORKS

The Complete Work of Christ

Question 1: What does it mean to repent?

Answer: It is to have a complete change of mind in response to the prompting from the Word, in the following way: Recognizing one's sin, and who we have sinned against. Being sincerely sorry, seeking and asking for forgiveness, turning away from your sin, striving not to fall again. It is responding to the gift of God and to stop placing any confidence in religious works to be accepted of God.

Question 2: How does your conscience affect your Christian walk?

Answer: If one sins now as a Christian, guilt (conscience) causes one to act or react by doing some work to cancel the sin. We need to know and discern our standing in Christ so that we can deal with the consequences of (the) sin, without reverting back to our old mind (set) of covering up and not be honest with our God. In dealing with the sin our conscience cannot be our guide because we need a change of mind, to be set free from the guilt of sin. This is only possible by being obedient to the word. Our conscience is purged from dead works.

Question 3: What are dead works?

Answer: These are works of self justification which God does not accept. A once and for all sacrifice was paid by Jesus on the cross, where sin was dealt with completely. Sin, which separated us from God, needs to be recognized and dealt with now according to His purpose and plan. The blood of Christ once shed, according to God's reckoning, clears our conscience from going back to try to appease God any other way. We cannot now offer anything, sacrifice, religious effort, or work to be accepted of God. Our own works will produce pride!

STUDY 2

Question 4: What effect should true repentance have on your life?

Answer: True repentance is the ability given to us by God, that from a sincere heart, godly sorrow will work true repentance that needs not to be repented of again. The following should be evident if one has truly repented:

- A carefulness not to succumb again to temptation, deed etc.
- A clearing of oneself, putting right where necessary
- To be indignantly actively determined not to turn back again
- To have an earnest, passionate, forceful desire not to sin again
- To have a fervent devotion to please God
- To be decidedly aggressive in not going back to the sin again – in this one will have cleared oneself in the issue (sin)
- We will bring forth the fruit God wants from us.

STUDY 3 – FAITH TOWARD GOD

Absolute Confidence

Question 1: What is faith and where is it from?

Answer: It is a gift from God, through which God imparts His righteousness through the work of Jesus on the Cross! Substance of things hoped for, (which is) being the confidence, the assurance and the hope which is ours in Christ that he will raise us up on the last day! Evidence of things not seen, (which is) being the visible manifestation of obedience in our lives and the ability not to give up, not considering the obstacles. Receiving Christ's (ability) faith to please our heavenly Father in all things.

Question 2: How should we exercise faith?

Answer: Come to our Father – believing without doubt or question. We need to allow His word to fill our minds that diligently we can then be obedient to its instruction. Not leaning back on our understanding or intellect. Giving place to the living Christ within, believing from (in) our hearts and confessing with our mouth. Not seeing yet believing.

Question 3: How does our faith grow?

Answer: As we surrender our minds to the word – unconditionally, that measure of faith within, grows. It all centers around the attitude of our hearts, whether we want to subject our minds to the foolishness of preaching. God speaks through His word by the 5 gift ministries, we need to hear and be obedient to its instruction, reproof, encouragement etc. Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Question 4: What is faith not?

Answer: Faith is not:

- Concentrating hard, trying to align one's thoughts, without distraction, to God for Him to hear and answer us – nothing to do with man's intellect.
- A formula to get something.
- Stirred up emotionally.
- A feeling that comes over us.
- A magical power.

STUDY 3

Question 5: Why is there no other way to please God?

Answer: Our Father will only accept the work His Son has accomplished on the cross as the sole guarantee and basis of His acceptance of us. He willed it that all glory belongs to His Son. Thus only from 'The Christ' within, everything done now as a Christian has to be established from the word alone and our obedience to it, trusting Him completely 'at His word'.

Question 6: How do you know that you have faith?

Answer: By exercising Faith toward God – is simply choosing to believe God's word and doing it, above the evidence of senses, knowing natural circumstances are to be kept subject to the word of God.

STUDY 3

STUDY 4 – DOCTRINE OF BAPTISMS - IMMERSION INTO CHRIST

1ST Baptism: Baptism into the Body of Christ

Baptism; from Greek word “Baptiso” to dip or immerse –

3 essentials required - 1.Candidate - 2.Baptiser - 3.Element for baptism

Question 1: What does being baptized into the Body of Christ mean?

Answer: We were in the world – unsaved, when we received Christ we took on the likeness of Christ; our sin was nailed to His cross and when He was buried our old man (nature) was buried with Him. When He arose, we rose with Him in newness of life, this is/was a spiritual experience that happened (occurred) through faith – we were translated into the Kingdom of His Son (Christ) we were immersed into Jesus by the full work of the cross. This is a spiritual reckoning that we have to apply. We have now received “Sonship” having been adopted into the family of God.

Question 2: Who is the candidate, the baptizer and what is the element?

Answer: For this baptism to take place.

- The Candidate (person) is a repentant sinner, who has recognized the need of Christ in his/her life.
- The Baptiser is the Holy Spirit who baptizes, puts us in Christ.
- The Element is the body of Christ, which brings us into a personal relationship with Christ plus, then we will be added to His church (the body of Christ), as it has pleased His Father, and by His Father.

Question 3: What is the reason for this baptism?

Answer: That having accepted Christ the old man (nature) is dead, all old things have passed away; lifestyle, attitude, unforgiveness, bitterness, culture, pre-conceptions etc – all things are become new. A total new life in Christ has/is begun – the old nature has been crucified, that we no more serve sin, and now live in newness of life.

Question 4: What does this baptism - bring about (fruit) result?

Answer: This is the experience every believer has to have to be saved (being born again). It brings one into unity with the purpose of God for one's life; receiving Christ means – we are in Him – one body, having one hope, having one faith, having one Father etc, all because Christ has died and identified with all. Baptised into Christ gives us sonship, from where we now can bring forth fruit – for our God. Without this baptism (experience) – no hope, destined to eternal separation and damnation. We are married (one spirit) to Christ.

STUDY 4 – Part I

2ND Baptism: Baptism into water

Baptism; from Greek word “Baptiso” to dip or immerse –

3 essentials required - 1.Candidate - 2.Baptiser - 3.Element for baptism

Question 1: What does water baptism symbolise/declare/is it necessary?

Answer: Seal/sign of the righteousness which we have received at salvation, it's an outward expression of what has happened within at salvation, it also declares openly our obedience to Jesus' instruction. It is a picture of the circumcision of our hearts at salvation. Immersed into and coming out represents – cutting off/ leaving behind/ burying the old man/ life, rising in newness of life. It is symbolic, an outward declaration of what has happened spiritually. I have been baptized into His death, buried with Him, and raised with Him in newness of life.

Question 2: Who is the candidate, the baptizer and what is the element and method, and by what authority?

Answer: The candidate is – an obedient believer, the baptizer is – a fellow believer and the element is – water. The method is by full immersing as Jesus was and as Philip baptized the eunuch – ‘came out of the water’. On a believers confession of his faith (salvation) and belief, having gladly received the word, in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, the believer is put under and brought up again – out of the water.

Question 3: Does water baptism save, and cleanse sin?

Answer: This baptism does not save us or have any cleansing power; only the blood of Jesus can wash our sin away, on the cross of Calvary.

Question 4: What does this baptism - bring about (fruit) result?

Answer: This baptism – leads us into fulfilling all righteousness, it gives us the answer of a good conscience toward God, it is a commandment of the Lord Jesus, that should be obeyed – obedience, it is an ordinance of the Christian church, and has the full authority of heaven behind it. We are now righteous (sons).

3rd Baptism: Baptism of the Holy Spirit

Baptism; from Greek word “Baptiso” to dip or immerse –

3 essentials required - 1.Candidate - 2.Baptiser - 3.Element for baptism

Question 1: What is the purpose of baptism of the Holy Spirit?

Answer: This is a free gift to all, it cannot be earned, and it was promised by the Father, Jesus had to leave for the Holy Spirit to come so that we, His church, could be endowed with power from above to be witnesses to Him and His (Jesus) purpose and His plan for the world. This power to be available to us with this baptism (because) the manifestation thereof would be the 9 gifts (of the Holy Spirit) given to the Church to use – that by this Christ alone would be glorified and magnified in any application thereof.

Question 2: Who is the candidate, the baptizer and what is the element? Does this baptism come with salvation?

Answer: The candidate is – a thirsty believer, the baptizer is – the Lord Jesus and the element is – The Holy Spirit. No, the disciples, already believers, had to tarry (wait) for the Holy Spirit to descend. Another example: Acts 19 – which is 25 years after Pentecost, with certain believers in Ephesus, had not even heard about the Holy Spirit. In Acts this baptism came by laying on of hands, while under the preaching of the word etc. it is the same today.

Question 3: What effect does this baptism have on a believer’s life?

Answer: The effect of this baptism is what Jesus promised – greater works would be done, the Holy Spirit would abide with us forever, the Holy Spirit would be in us, He would be a comforter, and would be like a river that flows from within, signs will follow the ministry and we would receive power to be a witness ‘unto Him’ in our service.

STUDY 4 – Part III

Question 4: What is the Holy Spirit's work on a believers life? and on the world?

Answer: The Holy Ghost was sent once Jesus went back to heaven to fulfill the following in a believer's life – teach all things, brings all things to remembrance, testify of Christ, He will guide us into all truth, not speak of Himself, and will only speak that which He hears, He will show things to come, and will only glorify Christ. To the world the Holy Spirit's work is to reprove of sin and righteousness and judgment to come.

Question 5: How do you receive this baptism? and the result thereof?

Answer: We must believe in Christ, must have clean hearts, must be obedient, must thirst (have a longing and desire), we must ask and can receive by faith. The outward manifestation thereof will be the 'speaking in tongues' plus the receiving of the 9 gifts as God sees fit to give. We cannot merit this experience (baptism) it is God's gift to the church when Jesus left. We now become powerful, righteous sons.

4th Baptism: Baptism into the sufferings of Christ

Baptism; from Greek word “Baptiso” to dip or immerse –

3 essentials required - 1.Candidate - 2.Baptiser - 3.Element for baptism

Question 1: What is the purpose of this baptism and significance of the identity with Jesus in this?

Answer: This baptism we cannot get away from if we want to live Godly in Christ Jesus, for this is the will of God for us. Being born into a sinful world with all its lust, attractions, tribulations, trials, persecutions etc and our fleshly, adamic nature is so easily affected thereby, God knew Jesus would have had to be subjected to the same, so we now have a High Priest / intercessor who can identify with us in all things. Our Christian stand in Christ will bring us into conflict with the world and our old adamic, carnal natures. Suffering, with Christ is God’s purpose and way for us to be conformed to His eternal will. Bringing us to obedience to the spirit and fearing weakness of flesh.

Question 2: Who is the candidate, the baptizer and what is the element? And what is the world?

Answer: The candidate is – The believer
The Baptiser is – the world and,
The element is the sufferings of Christ. Living as a believer in the world where satan rules and moves as a roaring lion, puts us in the forefront of the battle. So the cross we gladly bear is at the expense of anything that affects us in the world today – such as rejection, trials, tribulations, suffering, hurts etc. living today, all these things will be our portion – working in and for us.

Question 3: Why is this baptism so necessary in a believer’s life?

Answer: As Jesus had to learn obedience by the things He suffered, and we are not greater than our Lord, now we have to learn obedience. This can only come as we submit ourselves to our Fathers will. This brings us into a closer relationship with Jesus for today, working for us a far more exceeding weight of glory. Therefore as Paul – we can glory in tribulation, count it all joy when we come into divers temptations, and greatly rejoice in every trial etc.

STUDY 4 – Part IV

Question 4: What result or fruit does this baptism bring about?

Answer: The baptism brings us to a place, where we know we are pleasing our Father and that the more we humble ourselves under His mighty hand, by suffering, for righteousness sake, the greater the joy and blessing in our lives. The key being that His grace is sufficient for us and when we are weak He is strong on our behalf. The result / fruit of this continual experience / baptism is that from our hearts we are obeying our God. We can now say we are – obedient, powerful, righteous sons, and Christ receives all the glory. We are totally immersed in Christ.

STUDY 5 – THE LAYING ON OF HANDS

Freely you have received, freely give

Question 1: What is the reason / motive for this physical application?

Answer: This is a scriptural way of imparting a blessing on someone, encouraged by the head of the Church – Jesus. As a born again Christian, having freely received, one can now apply this physical contact, in freely giving. In the different applications and examples given to us in the word of God.

Question 2: What does this application represent?

Answer: Christ is the head of the body – His church; he left the church with 5 gift ministries and the Holy Ghost who came with 9 gifts. This physical impartation of His blessing and influence can now be administered representing His hands, which is what He did. In the Old Testament; blessing, authority and responsibility was expressed in hands be laid on e.g. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Moses, Joshua.

Question 3: Give two examples of where there is a physical blessing imparted?

Answer: e.g. 1. The blessing of children, for of such is the Kingdom of heaven.
e.g. 2. The blessing of healing for the sick, body.

Question 4: Give three examples, where there is a spiritual blessing imparted?

Answer: e.g. 1. For the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
e.g. 2. For the recognition of ministries.
e.g. 3. For the gifts of the Holy Ghost.

STUDY 5

STUDY 6 – RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD

Our Hope

Question 1: Why is Christ's resurrection so important to us?

Answer: If Christ had not died and risen:

- We would still be in our sin.
- The evil one, who had the power of death, has it no more and the sting of death, hell and the grave has no more hold on us.
- Our preaching would be in vain. God in His eternal purpose created man and this world and then that Christ would come, live die and be resurrected, so that man could ultimately be with Him in heaven where He would rule, be honored and glorified. The resurrection has now made heaven available for man that we may be like Him, and with Him.

Question 2: What did Christ's resurrection accomplish/fulfill?

Answer: Life from the dead, and the Fathers will was fulfilled. As Christians our whole future, whether we die or remain till Jesus comes, is established on His resurrection, and that He is now able to be 'the one and only faithful High Priest' at the right hand of God our Father. He became flesh and blood to die that He might purchase himself a bride to be with in heaven, because flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of heaven. This is our hope to an inheritance undefiled that will never fade away.

Question 3: How will our resurrection come and affect us?

Answer: All those in Christ (blood washed saints) dead or alive at Christ's return, will experience the resurrection. Death, satan, hell etc. forever no more fear. There will be a shout from the archangel, the trumpet will sound, and we shall be changed. The dead will rise, and then those remaining will change from this mortal (earthly flesh and blood) to immortality (heavenly body) and together meet the Lord in the air, ever to be with Jesus, never ever to be separated again. In heaven to fulfill the heavenly, eternal purpose of God.

STUDY 6

Question 4: Where and what does our resurrection take us to?

Answer: As it is appointed unto men – once to die after this the judgment, we all have to stand before our God – we have to be in His presence – one day, either in the resurrection of life or the resurrection of damnation. Having been judged at Calvary, our works will yet have to be tried. Nevertheless, our bodies will be raised in incorruption, in power, in glory, a spiritual body bearing the image of the heavenly, like Christ's to eventually rule and reign with our Saviour.

NB! The resurrection is not a gift it's an attainment.

STUDY 6

STUDY 7 – ETERNAL JUDGEMENT

Our Accountability

Question 1: Why judgement, and who is the judge?

Answer: It is an appointment of God, established in both old and new testaments, that His creation will have to stand before Him, whether they be throne's, principalities, powers, nations, angels or us – He is a loving and just God, who will call all to give an account. Jesus Christ was judged on our behalf for the sinful people that we were, and now by receiving and inviting Him into our lives, were accepted by Him, only on the merits of Calvary. God included all in/under sin, Jesus blood was shed that we could be free, grace and forgiveness being our portion. All judgment has been given to Jesus alone.

Question 2: Gods judgement and us, His blood washed sons / saints?

Answer: For the saved (born again) believer, the cross where Jesus died, was God's judgment for us, opening the way to eternal life. However, our works will be judged, and rewards will be given. We also have been given the responsibility to judge ourselves, not others. We also will experience the chastening of our God, as He deals with us as a loving Father. There is also God's dealing with sin in the church, where discipline is required.

Question 3: Who else will God Judge?

Answer: The nations will be judged, Israel will be judged, the wicked dead will be judged plus the angels will be judged. Accountability to God's instruction to His creation from the beginning requires obedience, the hardening of one's heart, sin etc. which brings disobedience, God will judge.

Question 4: Why should we be held accountable and what are the consequences of our disobedience?

Answer: Our God is a just and loving God, who cannot allow sin to ferment within us, the law failed in that it could not make any who kept it perfect, but being judged in Christ we were made perfect, able to walk in obedience and face the consequences of our sin. Should we continue in disobedience we will face God's final judgment. We are held accountable and thus kept on 'the straight and narrow'.

STUDY 7

STUDY 8 – GOING ON UNTO PERFECTION

If God Permit

Question 1: What is our position/or standing now as a Christian?

Answer: We are sons (and daughters) of the living God, been made righteous in His Son and accepted in the beloved. Born of God in the spirit, a chosen generation and complete in Him. The redemptive power of the cross has given us an inheritance that will never fade away. Our position is secure and established only on the merits of Christ's work continuing (in our lives) and our submission now to His (and our) Father's will.

Question 2: What is our present situation (or state) as a Christian?

Answer: Our present situation is a temporary one, where, as the word is obeyed and we walk as children of the light, putting off all that needs to go and putting on what God leads us in. As we grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus, we will continually change, having the mind of Christ, plus the ability from within to please our God.

Question 3: What is our/or the sanctification, perfecting process now as a Christian?

Answer: As children of God, we will need to be conformed to His will and He allows us to go through trials, tribulation, temptation, testing suffering so that the old man (flesh) can be totally crucified in our recognition of this godly process. We need the chastening and correcting of our God as we are lovingly drawn into a humble, meaningful relationship with Him. This sanctifying process will be our portion till Jesus comes to take us home.

Question 4: Why does God want us perfect?

Answer: Our God requires total holiness and needs us to be established in the position He has accepted us in, through and by His Son. We need to be conformed to His eternal purpose that in the ages to come we might continue to do of His good pleasure and will. Sin cannot be tolerated in any way, confession of which and repentance there from must prevail that His grace, mercy, longsuffering, forgiveness etc. be our portion, all till that day when we are changed, putting on immortality and be like Him. We need to submit our will completely to Him, that we may be made into His likeness.

STUDY 8

Question 5: What is the practical outworking of perfection?

Answer: Growing into maturity in Christ, developing understanding of our place in the Body of Christ, bringing our “measure” (gifts) to full development and function in the Body of Christ.
